- consensus of all stakeholders `experts' and with public input
- assist public authorities

Improve efficiency

- solve it once; don't reinvent the wheel
- allows specification by reference
- predictability

Assist inter-operability

- between jurisdictions (e.g. countries)
- nationally
- between organisations when communicating and trading

Contribute to public confidence

- safety
- reliability
- comparability


